FIRST READING Genesis 18:1-10

A reading from the book of Genesis

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said, 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'


PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS

AFTER THE CONSECRATION

We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

To pray, to listen to Christ, to have time for friendship and for love, to care for justice - all these are "the better part" which our busy world sometimes puts into very secondary places. Not so the gospel.



Gospel of contrasts – contemplative and active - The contrast is between two types of food – both necessary. The better food is to listen to the word of God, but not the only part.

A principal part of Christian life is listening to the word of God. That's where we learn to find God in the pots and pans where most of us spend our lives. Someone said – my children have left home, now I can serve the Lord! If she had listened to the word she would have known that in loving her children she served God! The word of God – what you do for others you do for me – would have taught her that loving the family was her service of God!

LISTEN IN PEACE

Listen in peace – Martha was warned about fretting and worrying – the quality of her cooking was not in question! The better part is to listen, so that we can work in service of others with love. Love grows at the feet of the Lord as well as in our human loves.

Otherwise our service can be grudging. We think - Why should I do it all? Or self-serving - look how lovely my tea is! Or fussy - go on, go on, go on, have another cup. Prayer teaches us to serve others with love.

Jesus reveals himself everywhere and in everyone. But our ears are attuned by time spent in prayer with him. We have to learn his language and listen. If we spend time at his feet, we will recognise him in other places.

So the mother in question – she had served God all her life, but she didn't know it. If you give time to the other part – listening in prayer, then you will find the better part in service too.
